



Big Tent Festival: Onsite Camping Information

General

By entering upon the site all persons agree to comply with all of the site rules and to accept any decision of The Organiser or its representative made under these rules.

This is a Prebooked Campsite - You must pre-book your Weekend+Camping Tickets (Adult/Concession and Children) in order to camp. You can do this through our ticketing agency. **This is a tent only campsite – there are no facilities for campervans or caravans.**

Parking: No vehicles allowed on the campsite. Campers will be directed to a parking area close to the campsite. The Car Park will be closed to vehicles between 00.00 and 06.00 on the days of the festival. The speed limit for all vehicles in the adjacent car park is 10 mph. Please observe traffic signs and follow any traffic system.

Access: The campsite is open from 12pm Friday 23rd until 12pm Monday 26th July. No tent will be sited after 9.00pm on Friday 23rd July, campers will be able to arrive from 8am on Saturday 24th July for set up in addition to Friday arrival and the decision of the site steward as to whether they will site a tent or not will be final. You must have fully vacated the site by 12pm on the 26th. The Site office will be open between 11am and 9pm on Friday, from 8am – 9pm Saturday and Sunday and from 8am – 12pm Monday. Outside these hours Security is available for emergencies only.

Pitches: There is a designated 'Quiet Zone' for family campers. Please request this when you arrive. This is strictly on a first come first served basis. All pitches must have a space of 3 metres away from each other. Tickets and Wristbands must be presentable at all times. You may be required to provide proof of your entitlement to be on the site at any time. **REPEAT: this is a tent only campsite – there are no facilities for campervans or caravans.**

The site is set out according to national guidelines to protect you and your neighbours against the risk of fire. It is set out in alternate lanes and roadways by posts and ropes/tape. You will be asked to site your pitch within a lane. Please do not overspill into a roadway as these are required to be clear for access by emergency vehicles. Depths of pitches are therefore defined. Widths of pitches have been left for your common sense.

Safe distances **MUST** be left between pitches as stated below:

- a. A recommended 3 metres must be kept between any awning/tent in an adjacent pitch.
- b. Any windbreak or other enclosure of the pitch must be positioned to ensure a minimum clearance of 1 metre to any adjacent awning/tent.

Tents not sited in accordance with these rules will be required to move and the Site Stewards instructions will be followed.

Facilities

Toilets and washing facilities are provided: You are asked to assist in keeping the toilets and washbasins clean. Stand pipes for drinking water are provided. Washing at the drinking water standpipes is not permitted and waste buckets should only be washed at the taps provided at the disposal point.

Camp Shop and Café: The Camp Shop and Café will be located at The Stables Workshop. You can access it from the West end of the field. It will be sign posted. Please ask for directions at the site office if you are unsure. The shop and café will be open for meals and refreshments throughout the festival.

The Organiser reserves the right to refuse entry or eject from the site any person who fails to comply with the rules or is causing a nuisance or disturbance to other clients on the site. If any of these rules are broken,

Security may terminate the permission to use the site without warning and forthwith may require the persons concerned to remove themselves, their tent and vehicle and other possessions from the Falkland Estate. If this rule is applied, no payment will be refunded. Any person ejected from the site may be prohibited from attending the site in the future.

Camping Rules & Safety

Noise: Please respect our neighbours and your fellow campers. Strictly no loud music and no music after 11pm at all. If a complaint about noise is received one warning will be given then campers may face eviction from the site.

Alcohol: Please drink responsibly and consider others around you. Strictly no alcohol is to be brought from the campsite to the main festival field.

BBQ'S: All BBQ's to be raised off the ground. BBQ's must be monitored at **ALL TIMES**.

Recycling: On arrival you will be given bin bags, green for recycling, black for rubbish. Around the site you will find recycling drums for your cans and bins for your rubbish. Campers are responsible for the collection and control of their own litter and refuse. There will be a refuse collection each morning and on closure of the site. Refuse may be left in sealed refuse sacks on the edge of the access roadways for collection.

Fires & Fireworks: Fires, Fireworks and pyrotechnics are strictly prohibited. Anyone found lighting the latter may face ejection from the site. A fire point is sited at the site office. If a fire occurs, move everyone outside your tent to a safe distance and warn the occupants of the nearby tents. Make use of extinguishers and use a mobile phone to call 999.

Security and personal belongings: The Big Tent organisers accept no responsibility for lost, damaged or stolen property and/or personal items. Security staff and campsite stewards have been appointed by the Organiser and are responsible for the management of the campsite and administration of these rules.

Smoking: Smoking is not permitted in the toilet or shower blocks

Animals/Pets: No animals except registered Guide dogs are allowed on the campsite.

Children: No person under the age of 13 is to be left in a tent without the supervision of an adult, and parents are expected to be responsible for the behaviour and safety of their children. It is not permitted to play around the tents, toilets and shower blocks or car park.

All rules will be strictly adhered to and in all circumstances regarding their application the Site Steward's decision is final. Please read them carefully and speak to the Site Steward or members of the security detail if there is anything that you do not understand. The Big Tent Festival will not be held responsible if you choose not to obey these rules.
